## GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

### Rules and Instructions:-

**A Candidate seeking admission to this College is required to note the following instructions:**

- (1) To fill up the particulars in the prescribed admission form.
- (2) To produce following documents along with admission form.
  - (a) DMC of the lower examination.
  - (b) Character certificate from Head of the institution last attended
  - (c) A proof of permanent residential address
  - (d) Four passport size photos
- (3) Those candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from Boards other than PSEB/CBSE are required to produce Eligibility Certificate obtained from the Punjabi University, Patiala
- (4) Those candidates who have passed their graduation or other equivalent examination from Punjab/GNDU/PTU are required to produce Migration Certificate and those who have graduated from a University outside Punjab are required to produce University Eligibility Certificate.

### Rules for withdrawal

A student must apply for withdrawal in writing to the Principal. The application must be countersigned by his / her father / Guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/she has cleared all College dues.

### Result Late Cases

Candidates whose results are to be announced later are allowed to join only provisionally. They may apply for admission within 10 days of the notification of the result.

### Code of Conduct

**To foster a sense of discipline among the students, a code of conduct has been framed by the College. The College expects the students to observe this code of conduct in letter and spirit.**

- No student will be allowed to enter the College premises without College Identity Card.

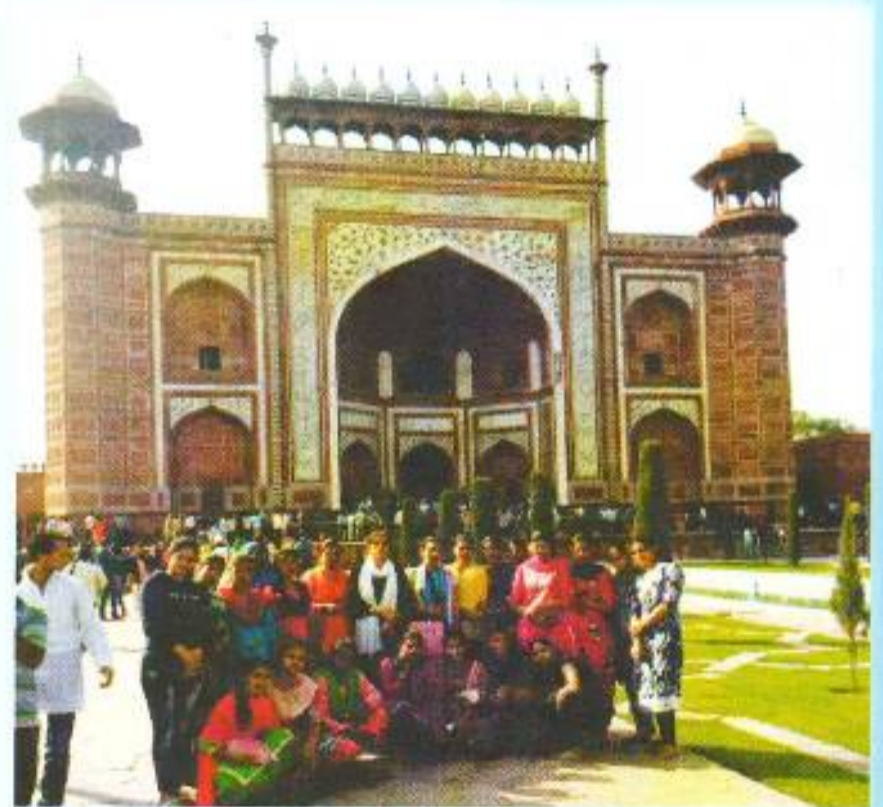

### STUDENT - SUPPORT SYSTEM

**Library** : The College library plays an important role in fulfilling the needs of the students. The College has well-stocked library on the first floor having books on various subjects namely Mathematics, Psychology, History, Political Science, Geography, R.D., Economics, Physical Education, Punjabi, English, Hindi, Science, Computer Application, Commerce, Agriculture and Fashion Technology etc. and Encyclopedias.

#### Library Cum. Identity Card :

Each student is provided a library cum identity card within fifteen days of admission. He/She must keep it person in the college campus. Duplicate Identity card is issued only in exceptional circumstances.

#### Library Rules:

**The Students are to abide by the following rules :**

1. In the Library, a student should be in possession of Library-Cum-Identity Card. Books can be issued only on this card.
2. Books are issued for fourteen days.
3. Students who fail to return the books on due date shall pay a fine of Rs. 1/- (one Rupee) per day.
4. Reference books, Rare books and Periodicals shall not be issued.
5. Students visiting the library should deposit their belongings at the property counter.
6. Use of library is restricted to bonafide students only.
7. Library remains open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on all working days.

#### Rules Regarding Attendance:

Only those students are allowed to sit in the University Examination who attend atleast 75% of the total lectures delivered and practicals conducted. Any student who continuously remains absent for one week, his/her name struck off temporarily from the the college rolls and in case he fails to seek re-admission within one week his name is permanently struck off. The Principal can done shortage of lectures of a student to a limited extent (as per rules) only on the recommendations of the concerned teacher.

#### Rules Regarding House Examination/Class Test :

The Students are to appear in atleast two class tests/ House Examination to be conducted by the college for Internal assessment. To be eligible to appear in the Semester University Examination, a candidate must have obtained in the House Examination at least 25% Marks in each Paper or 33% marks in the aggregate of all subjects of the House Examination.
